<p>Social, Moral, Spiritual, Cultural</p>	<p>Spiritual education in Psychology involves pupils having the opportunity to consider and discuss questions relating to aspects of human behaviour and development such as thoughts and beliefs and how they contribute towards behaviour in certain situations. Moral education in Psychology involves pupils considering the moral impact of psychological research on the wider society and applying psychological theories and concepts to real life events. Social education in Psychology involves pupils being encouraged to consider the behaviour, values, attitudes and roles of people in different societies and cultures. Cultural education in Psychology involves pupils appreciating the historical and cultural background to the growth of psychological understanding, and developing a critical and evaluative approach in relation to this.</p>
